MI 2019 Balloon Fiesta Rally Recap

The 2019 Monaco International Rally at the Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta (AIBF) held October 9th through 12th, 2019 was by all accounts another outstanding MI Balloon Fiesta Rally.

The Rally in essence was sold out with 80 coaches registered (80% were MI



members). Seventy-seven coaches were actually in attendance as a result of a number of late cancellations that the short time frame just did not allow replacement. In all, 177 individuals attended the Rally. One third of those attending the Balloon Fiesta Rally joined MI within the past year.

All who attended the Rally observed the Inflation of 588 registered hot air balloons, including over one hundred Special Shapes and 96 flying foreign flags from

17 countries. This IS an International event!

The weather was cool - those from FL said cold - but pleasant during the rally, dipping only into the mid-30s in the mornings. No rain or snow! The balloons were able to fly three of the four mornings of the rally and seven of the total nine days of the whole Fiesta. Balloon Glows occurred on all scheduled evenings, although cut short one night due to winds. Following the Glows were skydivers with pyrotechnics and then an enormous and spectacular Fireworks display. There were a lot of Oohs and Aahs in the MI Social Gathering Area as the fireworks were again truly outstanding and we had front row seats! Those who chose not to go down on the Launch Field missed out on being a part of the 900,000 who accessed the Launch Field and missed being Up—Touching close.

Monaco again had The Best parking location that could be had at the Balloon Fiesta. We were located in the first four rows of the premier VIP West Parking facility, immediately adjacent to the launch field. We were less than one hundred yards from the launching balloons and countless balloon flew directly over our coaches at 70 feet, close enough to talk to the pilot and passengers.

We were privileged this year to have two hot air balloon pilots talk to the rally group on the first night before and after one of our excellent included meals. The pilots provided a great history of hot air ballooning and explained the fundamentals of Lighter Than Air flight.

They also brought their balloon systems, and while they could not inflate the envelope, they set out their baskets and partially assembled their system so all could see the instruments. Many took advantage of having their picture taken while standing next to the basket.

Several MI rally participants took the opportunity to crew for a balloon during the Rally. A few indicated they planned to return next year to crew for the same pilot in hopes of getting a balloon ride.

This is common after crewing for the same pilot a number of times. Unfortunately, the balloon ride concessionaire was sold out weeks before the event this year disappointing some attendees. For 2020, we will try to provide details on how to sign up at an earlier date.

At least eighty percent of the MI Rally attendees were first time attendees at the AIBF and for a few, this was their first MI rally. As with most MI Rallies, there were numerous comments about the copious amounts of food available for rally attendees. Yes, we ate, and ate again. In addition to the catered BBQ dinner on the first night, we returned to the extremely popular El Pinto restaurant for a buffet lunch and also again had an outstanding Texas size New Mexico style breakfast of burritos one morning, a continental breakfast another day and of course, daily Social Hours with heavy appetizers.

We also experienced outstanding volunteerism from the Parking and Greeting Crew to the numerous volunteers who helped prepare daily appetizers and the photographers who captured the Rally. Many, many thanks to the volunteers who were essential in making the rally a success. Not enough can be said for the outstanding Advance Crew that assisted the Co-Hosts this year. They that included: Dan and Mary Beth Scott, Jim and Pat Goettinger and Jan and Marshall Couch. Also a special thanks to Roy and Jackie Holt who jumped in at the last minute to cover for a medical issue of one of the Team Members and to Lee and Kathie Fowler (guest of the Scotts) who also helped out with the arrivals and daily appetizers. Co-Host Roger Smalley took dozens of photographs which will be posted to the MI website.

We have already reserved/registered for eighty spaces in 2020. MI rally dates for 2020 are October 7th through 10th, departing mid-morning on the 11th after ballooning activities are over. As custom for the last two years, only MI members can apply through mid-April. On April15th, registration will open to all FMCA members on a first-come basis, but non-members must have an MI member who is also attending as a sponsor. We want to provide an opportunity for friends who travel with MI members to also attend. We have actually picked up several as MI members when they learn they can join if they have a REV product.

The 2020 theme for the Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta is Time Flies. So start your planning now to trek to Albuquerque in October, 2020 and register early. Remember: Time Flies!

TECH TIPS



Yes, it's Winter! Some of you may have already put your coach in storage for the Winter and others migrated South. Either way, there are engine and generator issues you need to consider.

If your coach has been winterized and put in storage, you still should "exercise" your genset at least once a month to keep it lubricated and seals flexible. You should do this by starting the generator and running it for a couple of hours with a "load". A load can be provided by turning on your roof heat pump(s) or by running a couple of 1,500 watt space heaters or drying a load of clothes in the dryer if you have one. Watch a football game while you are there!

Even if you are in the deep South and living in your coach, you still should exercise your genset at least monthly. This does not mean just starting and turning off. You should run it for 1-2 hours with a load applied. If you are way South, you may be able to run your roof ACs on a very warm day to provide the load. If you are not into football, while your generator is being exercised, this is a good time to lubricate your entry steps and other hinges with Kwikee "Grease Gun in a Can", so you won't be surprised in the Spring when you open the door and the steps stay put because of corrosion.

Oh yes, don't forget your engine. It needs to be started and brought up to operating temperature (160 - 170 degrees) to eliminate any moisture and to keep seals pliable. Starting and turning the engine off immediately does more harm than good because of condensation when first starting. A side benefit is you are also keeping you batteries charged up when running the engine or generator for a while.

A little time each month in the winter can save a lot of time consuming and expensive headaches when you are ready to hit the road.

TIPS AND TRICKS

Blood stains: Soak the spot in hydrogen peroxide then wash. Don't dry! Repeat if necessary. If the stain is small, the person whose blood it is can spit on the spot and it will go away. (I tried it and it actually works) This item was a suggestion from Debbie Darby from American Coach Association.

Shout Color Catcher: This product works well in RV washers, is excellent for small loads and allows you to mix whites and colors in the same load. According to the package, the "sheets trap loose dyes and dirt released during the wash cycle". At the end of the wash, the dye and dirt come out on the Color Catcher sheet, not on your clothes." Splendide, the makers of most of our washers, however, recommend that you put the sheet in a mesh bag so it won't accidentally go down the drain and stop up the plumbing!
